Key Stage 3

Year 7s will take part in a PSHE Day on Achieving Economic Well Being – this is a fun filled and enlightening day which has been a real success over previous years. It concentrates on Personal Finance Education and introduces students to managing their money and looking at their future career options as well as discovering the personal skills and qualities necessary to get there.



Year 8s will be given the opportunity to experience a 'World of work' day which introduces them to the skills required in the work place and how their curriculum subjects help to develop these.

Through these projects they meet new people, learn new skills and take part in challenging opportunities. They are encouraged to develop their personal and social skills by taking part in activities including sports, drama, dance, music, workshops, outdoor education, DofE, forums, residentials and volunteering.

We help young people with the issues which are important to them such as jobs, careers and education, relationships, sexual health, confidence, self-esteem, substance misuse, staying safe, housing and independent living skills.
