How to Crochet a Book Christmas Tree Decoration (remember Crochet Club on Tuesday if you need wool or help!)



Make the pages.

Row 1: Make a chain of 32.

Row 2: Then starting in the 2nd chain from hook, crochet 31 single crochet across. Turn.

Row 3: Chain 1 then work 31 single crochet. Turn.

Row 4: Chain 1 then work 31 single crochet.
Fasten off.

Make the cover

Row 1: Make a chain of 23.

Rows 2 to 11: Chain 1 then crochet 22 single crochet. Turn.
Row 12: Chain 1 then crochet 22 single crochet. Fasten off.

Sew on face

Sew or crochet the book together
Add a cord to hang from the tree.




