We aim to get every Year 11 student booked in for an appointment with an advisor before the end of the academic year. Every student will then be followed-up by myself to check they are set for their next steps.

Services for Young People

It is essential that students do not miss their meeting as this wastes valuable time. Students are asked to make a note of the time, date and place of their meeting when Tutors announce them prior to the day. If students are unable to attend their appointment they are asked to swap with another student in their form group and inform myself or Ms Charter so that their slot can be re-scheduled. Reminder cards are issued to students via their Tutors on the morning of their meeting to ensure they don't forget!

A 'Drop-In' session is also offered at break and lunchtime whereby students can go along, without an appointment, to ask any questions they have re: their future.

VISUALISING YOUR FUTURE

If your child is unclear about their future, then this visualisation activity may help.

Firstly, find a big sheet of paper and focus on a date in the future (it could be I year from now, 2 years etc). Next, have a think about each of the following points...

Describe your physical surroundings

Use as much detail as possible. Where do you live? Where are you working or studying? How does it look? What features does it have?

What is the atmosphere like?

How does the atmosphere in your personal life differ from the work or study atmosphere? How do you contribute to those atmospheres?

Do you have any regrets?

Why do you regret it? Did you learn anything from it? What would you do differently if given the chance?

Describe the people surrounding you

Who are they? Are they part of your work life or your personal life? How many people are there? What are their personalities like?

What are you most proud of?

What did you do? How did it make you feel? Would you do it again if you were given the opportunity?

How do you like spending your free time?

Do you have any hobbies? Do they link to a particular career? Do you do them on your own or as part of a group? Are they indoor or outdoor activities?

Once your child has started to develop ideas about what they want their future to look like, encourage them to find imagery (pictures, quotes etc.) to represent these thoughts and create a 'vision board'. It can help to have a visualisation of how their future could look.
