


Knowledge Organisers



The HAPpy programme (Holiday Activity Programme) aims to counter the triple inequalities facing Hertfordshire's most disadvantaged young people – holiday hunger, physical inactivity, and social isolation. This holiday provision is for school aged children from Reception to year 11 (inclusive) who receive benefits-related free school meals. These families should've been sent out their winter booking codes already.

They are also running a primary school aged football camp at the same location on the same days, so if they have any younger siblings then they can all attend a football camp at the same location, hopefully this would ease the burden on those families struggling the most.
