Year 11

Year 11 pupils received their GCSE mock grades in a special assembly this week. In December students sat GCSE papers, which were marked using the exam board mark schemes and graded using the expected grade boundaries for 2023. This gives teachers, pupils and parents a helpful snapshot of current performance.

Mr Spencer spoke to the students about the importance of revision in the lead-up to the actual exams in the summer and introduced sixth formers Franciszek and Ikenna who shared their GCSE experiences with the Year 11 students. In his GCSEs Franek achieved 10 grade 9s, 1 grade 8 and also completed an AS level in Spanish (Grade A) in his spare time in



Y11! Franek shared his study habits and conveyed how important persistent study is for achieving well. Ikenna is currently training to pursue his dream to be a heavyweight boxer. Ikenna discussed his habits for training, sleeping and managing his diet in the lead up to fights. Ikenna also reflected on how he approached his GCSEs and shared advice for Year 11 students. Both Franek and Ikenna were completely inspiring and students were enthralled hearing their stories.

In the coming weeks we will share more details of how we plan to support students in Y11 to revise purposefully and diligently in the coming months so that they can also achieve beyond their expectations.




The Library is open before school from 8am and after school until 4pm.


Knowledge Organisers

INTRODUCTION TO PSYCHOLOGY



Psychology is the study of mind and behaviour This means psychology is about everything and is everywhere!

Each week we will look at a current issue or case study and explore the psychology around it, as well as looking how psychology can be applied in everyday life.

For example:

- Why are people prejudiced?
- · Why are people aggressive?
- What is a psychological disorder?
- Why are there riots?
- · Why do we dream?
- Why are some people happy?



In History club, the students decide what we learn and this half term we are getting hands on with history.

We will be looking at different sources of evidence and asking 'what can we do with this?' We've looked at Horrible Histories magazines and decided to use them to make our own!

Later we will be getting hands-on with genuine objects from the Roman Empire.
