

The aim of the trip was to meet the staff at the Paris office who he has dealings with on a daily basis and attend various meetings. We took the Eurostar early on the first day and arrived at the office at 3pm. We attended several meetings which lasted around 4 hours.

There were many members of the senior leadership team in the meetings. They were discussing a new feedback system so that people could report on their experiences. I was able to observe the interactions between them and the way resolution was discussed."

Are Apprenticeships just for young people?

No, you do have to be a minimum of 16 years old to start an apprenticeship. However, there is no real upper age limit if you are interested in training in a new career later in life. It is becoming more common now for employers to train up existing members of staff through the apprenticeship route to help further their career development.
