Year 9 Natural History Museum Trip

Almost 100 Year 9 students enjoyed a capital adventure to celebrate the end of their Key Stage Three work.

We congregated at Letchworth train station at 9 o'clock in the morning and caught the 9.31 train out of Letchworth and disembarked at Finsbury Park Station at 10.10 to continue our journey on the London Underground, Piccadilly Line. Everyone arrived safe and sound at the Natural History Museum at 10.45, worksheets were handed out and the students had time before lunch to visit the various zones of the museum.

The students behaviour was exemplary and a credit to Fearnhill school. They enjoyed visiting the Earth sciences section and experiencing the Japanese earthquake simulator. The massive dinosaur exhibition in the Blue Zone was also a popular destination as was the creepy crawlies exhibit in the Green Zone.

After lunch we walked to Parliament Square. The students were in groups of 12 and we walked up through Knightsbridge, past Harrods superstore. Many of the students enjoyed spotting supercars and spending time in an area of London that is home to the rich and famous. After Knightsbridge we walked through Wellington Arch where the late Queen Elizabeth II was transferred from her gun carriage to her hearse during the state funeral. We then walked past Buckingham Palace, where sadly there was no Royal Standard flying and on down the Mall. We cut through Horse Guards and past Downing Street before meeting up again in the shadow of Big Ben and the House of parliament at Parliament Square.

After a quick head count next to the statue of Winston Churchill, everyone jumped back on the London Underground travelling 3 stops on the District Line to Blackfriars Station. A weary Year 9 and teachers embarked on the 3.22 out of Blackfriars and arrived back in Letchworth for 4.20pm.

A massive thanks must go to all the teachers involved, this includes those on the trip but also those that stayed behind covering lessons and running staff and lunches down and up to the station. Lastly well done Year 9 a great trip enjoyed by all, you were a credit to Fearnhill - we are very proud of you, here's to a brilliant Key Stage Four.

This week has seen the start of the Get Playing scheme at Fearnhill, whereby we have received funding from Herts Music Service for taster woodwind and brass lessons.

The idea is to give students a free taster of what music lessons are like and learn the basics of their instrument with the view to them signing up for further lessons and continuing their musical playing career.

Music is such an enriching experience for students as they get to learn discipline, rhythm, timing, perseverance and resilience as well as making many new friends and exploring many opportunities to play and perform. We are really keen to get more students playing instruments at Fearnhill.

The Get Playing free taster scheme deadline has passed now but we hope that there will be further opportunities next year to offer a similar scheme. However, if your student would like to learn to play an instrument, they can still sign up for paid peripatetic lessons (and heavy subsidy is available for low income and FSM students via Herts Music Service).

Year 9 students were spellbound by the presentation given to them by Peter and Moira Hart, son and daughter in law of the famous holocaust educator and survivor Kitty Hart-Moxon, OBE. They gave a talk about Kitty's experience through the Holocaust and spent time answering student questions afterwards. Kitty, a Polish-British Holocaust survivor, was sent to the Auschwitz-Birkenau death camp in 1943 at age 16, where she survived for two years, and was also imprisoned at other camps. Shortly after her liberation, she moved to England with her mother, where she married and has dedicated her life to raising awareness of the Holocaust.

Science

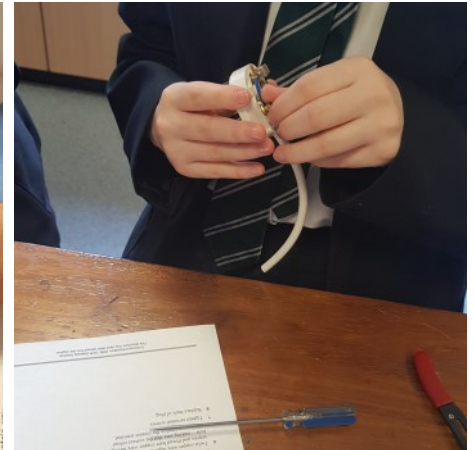
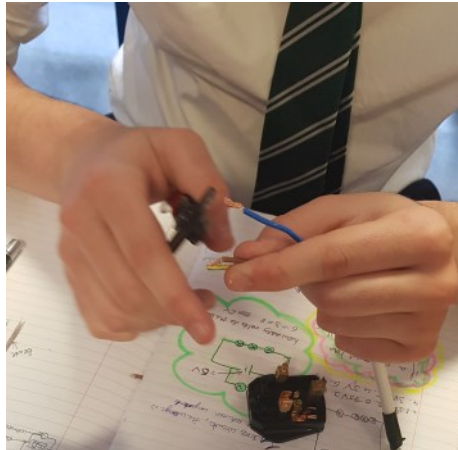
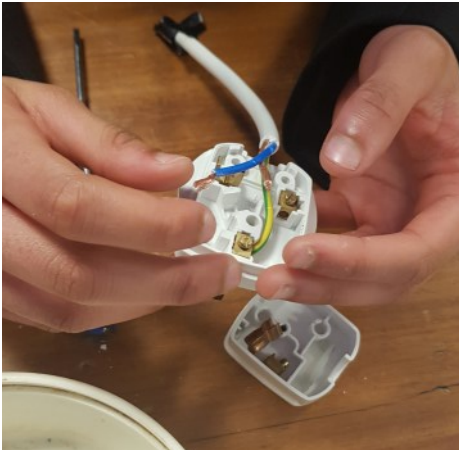
10Her have been learning about electricity over the past few weeks.

Sport - Comic Relief Football

Fearnhill staff and 6th form avenged the agony of their defeat on penalties last year to secure their first Comic Relief win against year 11.

On a lunchtime far sunnier than the MET office predicted, Year 11 faced off against the staff in an 11-a-side football game which really can be defined as a 'game of two halves'. The first half didn't see any goals for the first 15 minutes despite an appeal from the staff that Mr Williams' strike that ricocheted off the underside of the bar has crossed the line. To our Spring edition of the Schools Stay Safe Newsletter.
Read on for advice on ways to stay safe for you and your family.

Be Arson Aware!!

Advice to help you reduce the threat to your home and neighbourhood:

- Reduce access to your property for trespassers and opportunist arsonists.
- Secure your boundary, repair or block gaps in hedges, walls or fences.
- If you have gates close and lock them.
- Secure sheds, garages, and other outbuildings with padlocks or similar.
- Fit external lighting to alert you to intruders.
- Manage your refuse so there are no fuel sources for opportunists. Clear any rubbish from garden, behind sheds etc.
- Store wheelie bins securely, away from property and out of sight.
- Put bins out on collection day only and bring them back in asap.
- Large items like furniture, old vehicles or rubble provide a fuel source, contact your local council for advice on removal of bulky waste.

Cooking Safely for you and your Family

Leaving your cooking unattended is the biggest cause of kitchen fires. You should consider the following advice to stay safe:

- Avoid cooking when under the influence of alcohol.
- Avoid leaving children in the kitchen alone when cooking on the hob. Keep matches and saucepan handles out of their reach to keep them safe.
- Make sure saucepan handles don't stick out so they don't get knocked off the stove.
- Take care if you're wearing loose clothing as they can easily catch fire.
- Keep tea towels and cloths away from the cooker and hob.
- Spark devices are safer than matches or lighters to light gas cookers because they don't have a naked flame.
- Double check the cooker is off when you've finished cooking

Smoking and Vaping – are you safe?

In recent years, e-cigarettes have become a very popular stop smoking aid in the UK.

However, using the wrong charger can lead to an increased risk of fire.

We strongly recommend the following:

- Do not buy counterfeit goods as batteries and/or chargers are unlikely to have overcurrent protection and could lead to batteries exploding.
- Never use damaged equipment or batteries. Fire is not the only risk posed by vaping products and the liquid they contain can be highly toxic.
