Every Year 11 student will have had a 1:1 meeting with a qualified careers advisor, Jo Bains, and be given careers guidance timed and tailored for their individual needs and resulting in an action plan based on their goals.

These action plans are emailed to the individuals so they can be referred to as they work towards the goals set.

All students in Years 7-10 have the opportunity to attend the lunchtime drop-in on the days Jo is in, prior to their meeting in Year 11, if their circumstances require it.
