Services for Young People

We are pleased to welcome Chris Aylward, a Services for Young People Advisor, to Fearnhill school on designated days during the Autumn term to meet with students and discuss their options, ideas and opportunities available to them after Year 11. We aim to get every Year 11 student booked in for an appointment with an advisor before the end of the academic year. Every student will then be followed-up by myself to check they are set for their next steps.

It is essential that students do not miss their meeting as this wastes valuable time. Students are asked to make a note of the time, date and place of their meeting when Tutors announce them prior to the day. If students are unable to attend their appointment they are asked to swap with another student in their form group and inform myself or Ms Charter so that their slot can be re-scheduled. Reminder cards are issued to students via their Tutors on the morning of their meeting to ensure they don't forget!

A 'Drop-In' session is also offered at break and lunchtime whereby students can go along, without an appointment, to ask any questions they have re: their future.

Chris is covering for Jo Bains, our usual advisor, who is currently off recovering from an injury. We wish her a speedy recovery and look forward to welcoming her back in the Spring term fighting fit!

Nicole's Career Path

"I am an ABCS (Able Rate Catering Service) in the Royal Navy. I have competed in culinary competitions for the navy in the Tri service catering competitions, as well as representing the navy in the national Young National Chef of the Year where I made the final 2 years running. I have cooked for the Second Sea Lord (third highest ranking officer in the navy) as one of his chefs to provide high end cooking for royalty and other high profile guests.

I have cooked on board warships, HMS Defender, where I served up to 240 people 3 times a day whilst trying to keep morale high with good food. I got to spend a month in Australia helping a batch 2 offshore patrol vessel HMS Spey. Now I am currently drafted in the Falklands as a private chef for the commander of the base.

I absolutely love my job within the Royal Navy as you get to travel the world meet new people and sometimes get to cook at the top level. The great thing about being on ship is you're not just a chef; you do first aid, fire fighting, and therefore become a damage control 'expert'.

The Royal Navy for me was the best decision I've made in my career as I've only been in 2 years and I've managed to do all of the above after my phase 1 and phase 2 training which I finished in June 2022."

Special Mention - October III

Madison 8H took the opportunity of making the most of strike days in Year 7 by doing work experience.

"On the inset days and the strike days we had, I went into Northfields Infant and Nursery School and helped doing some activities with some Year 1 students. I did reading, art, some playtime duties and generally helping within lessons throughout the day. I also spent some time with Nursery children. This was voluntary and I did full School days."

This is fantastic evidence that Madison can use on her CV and for applications for future work experience, employment and further education in addition to the confidence Madison will have gained and the insight into the world of work Well done Madison!
