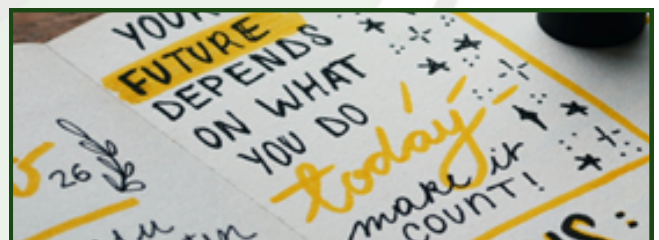

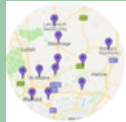

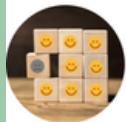

Ronnie 11H took the opportunity of making the most of the Summer holidays by doing work experience.

What made you choose to do this? *"To gain experience for the future."*

What skills are needed in the workplace? *"Time keeping, listening skills, using own initiative, independence, hard working."*

What did a typical day at work look like? *"I was picked up at 7am, travelled to sites and briefed on what needed to be done for the day. We then carried out the work needed, had a short break, then back to working for a few hours before lunch. There was probably another hour of work before the end of the day."*

What did you enjoy the most? *"Having a good experience and being helpful."*

What was the least enjoyable part? *"Waking up early!"*

Students will receive a certificate confirming their work experience.

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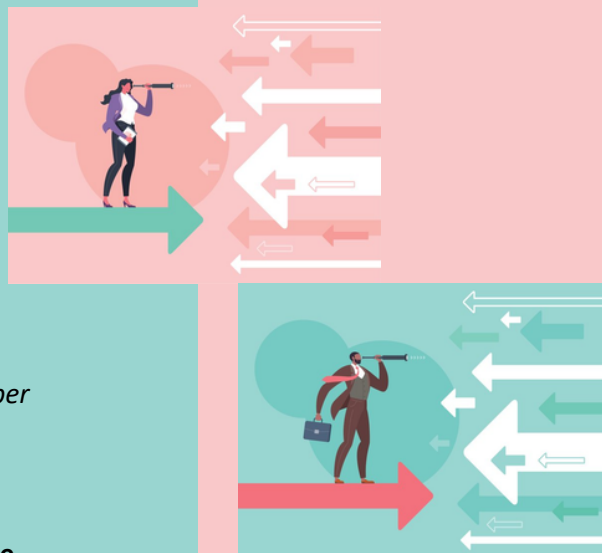


