
RESPECT AGENDA


Last week, students watched a virtual assembly where the results from the student respect survey were shared. You can see the results here:






CRIMINOLOGY TRIP - UNIVERSITY OF HERTFORDSHIRE



Year 12 and 13 criminology students spent the day at the University of Hertfordshire learning about the collection and processing of evidence for a murder case.

Nicola Coleman, a criminology lecturer, explained the process involved in evidence collection and students contributed in working out what personnel, such as forensic scientists and family liaison officers, would be needed and at what stage.

Following this, students went to examine a mock crime scene in a flat in the students' accommodation. From this evidence they began to piece together and understanding of what might have happened, and who they would want to question.

After lunch our students took roles of witnesses, defendant, police officers, etc in a mock trial in a purpose built mock courtroom in the law building. The jury found the defendant guilty, and the sentence was handed down by judge Her Honourable Lilly May-Jones.

It was an excellent day which linked perfectly to unit 3 of the Criminology Diploma, as well as being valuable in signposting possible career and higher education options for our students.

MOCK TRIAL AT ANGLIA RUSKIN UNIVERSITY

This month, a small group of sixth form students have been working on a mock trial. They had to prepare their case as the defense. This involved having weekly zoom meetings with a law lecturer and two law students from Anglia Ruskin University. Our students were directed week by week how to build their opening statement, cross examination of witnesses, defense arguments and closing statement.

After each zoom meeting students met again to go through witness statements and discuss how to best use the advice they were given in the context of a specific crime. Students worked like this for 6 weeks, then traveled to Cambridge to participate in the trial at the University. They went up against another school who took the role of the prosecution - and their work served them well, as they won the case!

This was excellent opportunity to learn how courts operate, how legal arguments are made, how evidence is used, as well as developing analytical and critical thinking skills - along with team work.

As Miss Corden said 'they did us proud'.




LIBRARY
