Should schools have silent corridors?

Some secondary schools insist that students move in silence between lessons during the school day. I understand why headteachers might make this decision, but it is not a strategy that I would want to employ.

I do not believe that it is the job of schools to control childrens' behaviour to this extent. Silent corridors work on the assumption that children will automatically be unkind and unruly if they are allowed to speak during lesson changeover. This is not my experience. It is also no preparation for the real world. Where else would a large number of humans in the same place be expected to move from A to B in absolute silence?

Corridor conduct

However, conduct around school is very important. We make clear our expectations to students regarding moving between classrooms and prioritise teaching respect. Last week was Respect Week (more details to follow) and it remains an ongoing priority to instil in all students an instinct to show respect to others in all situations. Sadly this has been lost in much of society. As a school we believe that we can change society rather than be changed by it.



Fire and lockdown drills

There are times when silence across the school is essential. During fire drills and lockdown drills we make no apology for

insisting that all students are silent throughout. We had a first practice of a lockdown drill last week and the students' response was excellent. Naturally we hope that we never need to respond to an emergency, but it is reassuring to know that students respond so well to the drills.

5. Reducing the Risk of Falling Behind

When students miss school, they risk falling behind in their studies. Each lesson builds upon the last, and missing school can make it difficult to catch up. Frequent absences can lead to gaps in knowledge that may affect a student's overall performance. Regular attendance ensures that students stay current with lessons and maintain a steady academic pace.

Note to parents/guardians: Expected attendance is 97%, meaning students who miss more than a day per half term are likely to underachieve and be at a significant disadvantage to their peers. Please support your child in attending school.

YEAR 8 TEAM MATHS CHALLENGE

On Monday 28 April 2025 eight of our Year 8 students took part in Heat 1 of the HFL Year 8 Challenge Mathematics Challenge against 12 other schools. There are four heats in total.

Fearnhill entered two teams, Team A and Team B. Students in our Team A were James L, Laura S, Eliana N and Damla E. Students in our Team B were Dash J, Ruben W, Tommy B and Cohen O.

Our students worked hard together to solve the challenging questions and finished 10th and 11th respectively.

The Year 8 Maths Challenge is a county-wide mathematics competition run by Herts for Learning Education. It is designed as an informal, friendly inter-school competition, designed to challenge young mathematicians who require excellent communication, problem-solving and team-working skills, as well as mathematical skill and insight.

Each challenge is divided into four equally weighted rounds:

Round 1: General maths questions

Round 2: Memory round Round 3: Estimation round

Round 4: More general Maths questions

The four day course ended with a spectacular 'Passing Out' parade where the students reenacted various scenes showing off what they had learnt and were then presented with certificates by the Commander of the Fire Service. 
