


"We help students compare every university course, every apprenticeship, and Further Education courses - then apply successfully."

At our 11-5 Hubs we offer information, advice and support with issues such as mental health, relationships, personal safety, benefits and finances, housing and homelessness, drug and alcohol use and more.

Young people who are not at school or college can come to our young people's centres for help with progressing into education, training or finding a job or apprenticeship.

Young people can also access sexual health services.

Young people can contact their local team to make an appointment before visiting or just drop in during the opening hours. Making an appointment in advance will ensure you don't have to wait to be seen. Phone or video-call appointments are also available.


