9. Improving Long-Term Academic Performance

SCHOOLS OF SANCTUARY CELEBRATION EVENT



Our wonderful school has recently become an official <u>School of Sanctuary</u>. This award recognises Fearnhill as a welcoming and supportive environment for young people of all backgrounds as well as raising awareness of the issues facing people in the asylum system. We are the first school in Hertfordshire to be recognised in this way and one of very few secondary schools. We held a celebration event on Monday 21st July, as part or Culture Day, which included attendees from the local council, the Letchworth Heritage Foundation and the Refugee Council as well as staff, students, school governors and parents.

YEAR 12 ACTIVITY DAY

On Thursday 10th July we took our Year 12s out for an exciting activity day at Essex Outdoors. Between them they took part in Kayaking, Abseiling, Archery, Stand Up Paddleboarding and All Terrain Boarding. WALTON ON THE NAZE











On Wednesday 16th July, 42 Year 10 Geography students went to Walton on the Naze, Essex to investigate the enquiry question: How successful are the coastal management strategies at Walton on the Naze. GCSE Geography requires all students to complete some physical and human geography fieldwork - this is the physical fieldwork.

We arrived at an overcast Walton on the Naze at 11.00am. Miss Cheeseman's group headed to the 'south' protected beach to measure the groynes to investigate the impact of the groynes on longshore drift. Mr Fowler took his group to the 'north' unprotected beach to measure the gradient, using the ranging poles and the clinometers. Both groups also completed width and other longshore drift and wave type experiments. After lunch the tide came in particularly fast, pushing us to complete our experiments quickly. We left Walton on the Naze at 2.30pm to return to school.

A great time was had by all - not too many sunburnt but many tired on the return journey. We returned to Fearnhill to present and analyse the data and to answer our enquiry question. A massive thank you to Mrs Boulter, Miss Northern and Miss Cheeseman for helping out on the trip and well down to the Year 10 geography students whose behaviour was exemplary and credit to the school.

DUKE OF EDINBURGH WALK

When you ask the average young person if they would like to walk from Letchworth to Welwyn or Ware, carrying a bag that weighs a quarter of their body weight in over 30° heat, and then walk back the following day in the same conditions they would probably say no; if they did not, they would either be woefully under-informed, or exceptionally brave and resilient. On Friday 11th of July, 14 of our Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award students proved themselves the latter as they set off on their Qualifying Expedition, walking 19.9km from the school to the Camping Centre at Cottered, just outside Buntingford.

Not only is this near 20km hike tricky at the best of times, but in the heat and sun in which they found themselves, it was not easy going! Luckily, Mr Fowler, Miss Mills, Miss Jennings and Mr Fox were situated at key checkpoints to assess their health, and top them up with copious amounts of water as they walked through Baldock, Clothall Common, Wallington and Shaw Green on their way to the campsite. Students did not just battle the heat and uneven ground, but also dealt with nausea, rolled ankles, and bad jokes as they journeyed towards their destination with the resilience and determination which we are always so proud to see in Fearnhill students. We were especially impressed with Mason Hinks (9N), Braeden Mann (9H) and Oliver Govier (9G) who pushed on through both days of the walk in exceptionally hot heat, when some students had to stop for medical reasons.

After the students arrived at the camp-site they put up their tents (which had been driven to the site by Mr Fowler in the school minibus to remove the extra stress in the heat) and began to cook substantial meals before retiring for the evening between the hours of 7-10pm. There they slept soundly until quite late on Saturday morning, whereupon they struck their tents, had breakfast (some ate cereal, some cooked pancakes) before wishing Mr Fowler a happy birthday and heading back home. Along the way they were able to see an impromptu airshow performed by a local Radio Control Plane group that flies out of a local airstrip!

Due to the weather concerns, the walk was terminated early at Baldock Tesco where the students enjoyed the shade before being collected by their parents, but all spirits were high and the students all reported having a wonderful experience which they would happily do again!
