Curriculum Vision & Enrichment

Fearnhill offers a rigorous and transformational education, that delivers excellence and challenge through a curriculum determined by the students themselves, leading their own journey and being regularly held accountable for their progress.

Our vision is for all students to flourish in their learning and develop the knowledge and skills needed to progress with confidence. For many that will mean obtaining fantastic academic qualifications to access some of the best universities and careers in the world. For others it will mean developing a broader range of skills, preparing for adult life, so that they can lead full and productive lives as members of their own community.

We achieve this by providing our students with:

- A stimulating learning environment.
- An ethos in which everyone is valued, respected, motivated, supported and encouraged to strive for success.
- A high quality of teaching and learning, through a skilled, trained and dedicated staff team.
- A student-led, broad but balanced curriculum.
- Care, support and guidance through a caring and nurturing community, resulting in excellent high-quality personal development and behaviour.
- Preparation for adult life by enabling work-based opportunities.
- Where appropriate, the facility to gain the skills necessary for paid employment through work-related experiences.

- External speakers.
- Involvement in our wide variety of school clubs such as School Production, Football, Cooking Club, Book Club, Board Games etc.
- Wellbeing sessions every fortnight.



Pastoral Support

Every student is allocated a form tutor, the first point of call for any concerns. The form tutor is equipped for both pastoral and academic support and meets with their tutees every morning. Students also have regular meetings with Form Tutors, the Head of Careers and the Director of Sixth Form. We also have a designated Sixth Form Coordinator who is available should any pastoral issues arise throughout the day.

Students with Special Education Needs can receive support and guidance from our SENCO, Mrs Cate Brown to help with accessibility.

Morning form time covers PSHE, discussions on current affairs, the VESPA mindset programme, personal development and study sessions. In Year 13, form tutors oversee university and apprenticeship applications.

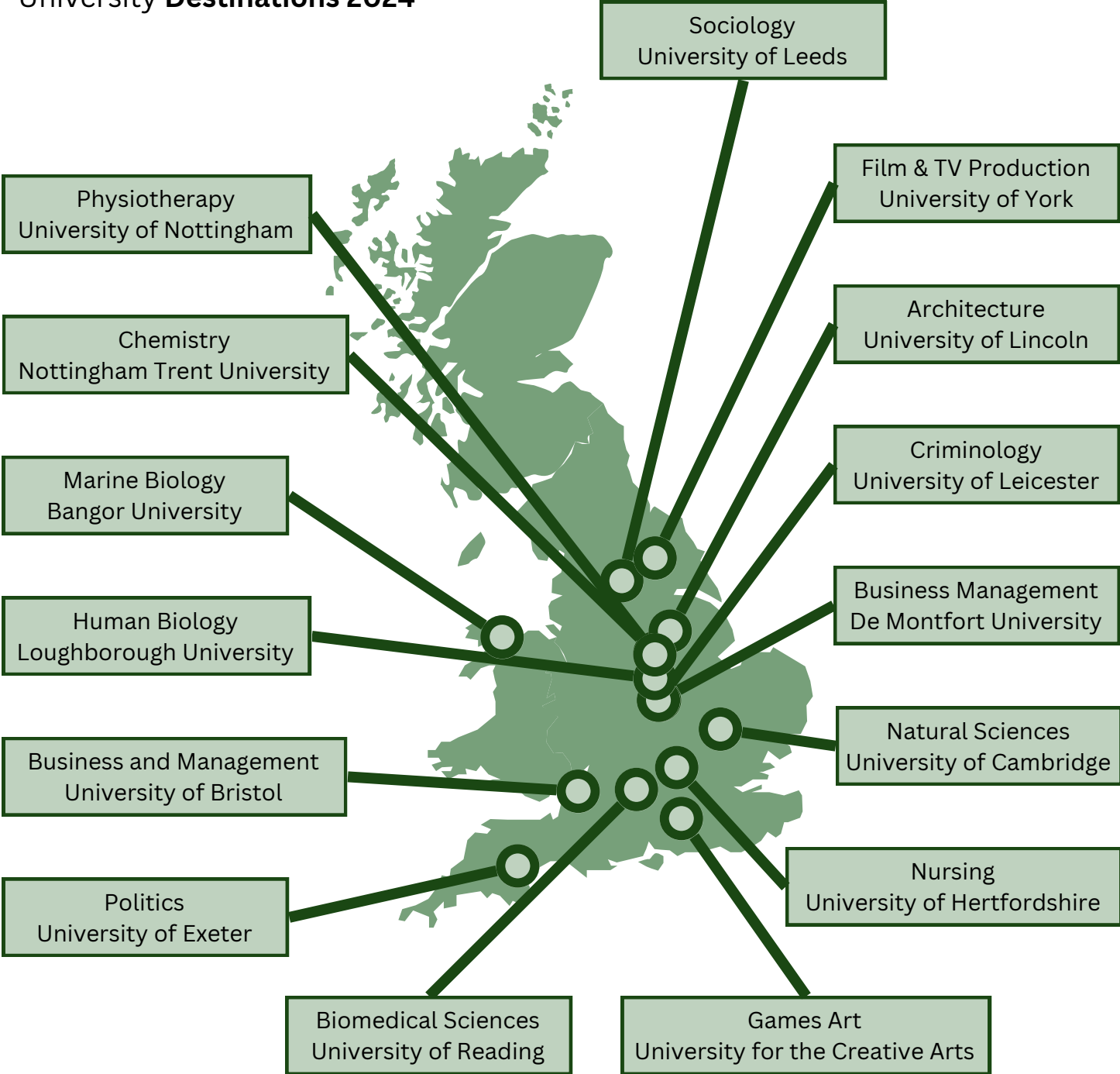
As a school, we have excellent links to local support networks, charities and groups to support our young people.

University, Apprenticeships, **Employment & Gap Years**

University

The majority of our students in Fearnhill Sixth Form go to university after they complete their studies. Some students will study a foundation course, an additional year to gain and solidify knowledge further. Students are supported with their UCAS (University applications) in school and can use Unifrog to help them choose the right courses and universities for them. All Sixth Form students attend the UCAS Exhibition in London, an opportunity to meet with different university and apprenticeship representatives to talk about applications. Fearnhill Sixth Form work closely with the local University of Hertfordshire to deliver workshops, talks and events for our students. We also have links with the University of Cambridge and the University of East Anglia.

Apprenticeships

At Fearnhill Sixth Form, we absolutely support students in applying for degree apprenticeships (Level 4-7). These allow for study alongside working for a company or organisation. These courses can take numerous years to complete and often result in full time employment as well as gaining a degree. Last year we had major success with one of our alumni gaining a degree apprenticeship in Software Development with MBDA and the University of Hertfordshire. We guide students with their applications and help prepare them for interview. Degree Apprenticeships are highly competitive, however, we encourage all students to consider them.

Employment & Gap Years

We also understand that for some young people, education will end after Sixth Form. We know that some of our students will want full time work when they leave us and we support them in doing so. For one of our alumni, Level 3 qualifications opened the door for them to be a store manager for a bakery; the skills they gained from being in Fearnhill Sixth Form really held them in good stead above other applicants. Another alumnus gained a job working at Easy Jet, training to be cabin crew. Fearnhill Sixth Form supported them with applications and interview preparation. Some of our students require more time to think about the future and take a gap year (a year to work, travel, improve their skills etc).

Support Beyond Sixth Form

When students choose to take a gap year, they are invited back to Fearnhill for further support and guidance meetings. We also offer one to one support when they are applying for their next steps.

External Support

Fearnhill Sixth Form uses these bursaries, networks, charities and groups to support our students even further.

Zero Gravity is a free online platform that propels talented pupils into top universities and careers through one-to-one mentoring, masterclasses, and a community of ambitious members. All of our students apply for this at the start of Year 12.

The Sutton Trust is an educational charity which aims to improve social mobility and address educational disadvantage. Students in Year 12 can apply for work experience, Summer Schools and other opportunities to support them with future applications.

InvestIn offers teenagers the opportunity to test drive their dream career through a range of immersive career experiences. Students gain hands-on experience alongside top industry professionals, enabling them to make the right career decisions and maximise their potential. Students can apply for these courses in Year 12 and Year 13. Fearnhill are an InvestIN partner school.

Unifrog is an online platform designed to help students to stretch their aspirational thinking and open their eyes to career pathways and how they can successfully get there. All students at Fearnhill School have access to Unifrog.

The 16-19 Bursary Fund is paid by the Education Funding Agency (EFA) to Schools and Colleges so that they may provide financial help to students whose access to or completion of education might be inhibited by financial consideration. The 16-19 Bursary Fund falls into two categories: Vulnerable Student Bursary and Discretionary Student Bursary and can be worth up to £1,200 per year.

Further information and support with all of these can be obtained from the Sixth Form office.





Choosing Your **Subjects**

If you know what you would like to do as a career in the future, make sure you do your research and ask yourself some of the following questions:

- What qualifications will help you in your choice of career?
- Do you know if you need specific qualifications?
- Do you need to go to University or is there an Apprenticeship route after Sixth Form?
- Is this career choice your only option or are you undecided? If so, should you broaden your selection of subjects?

Examples:

- If you wish to become a lawyer, some universities and employers recommend that you study History rather than a Law degree. You could look at choosing History, English Literature and Sociology as your options, which will also work well in many other career paths if you should change your mind.
- If you wish to become a Midwife or Nurse, you will have to study for a degree at university. Subjects to choose could be Biology, BTEC Health & Social Care and Psychology.
- If you wish to become an Engineer, you could look at Physics, Maths and 3D Design.

When choosing your options, consider the following questions:

- Are these my strongest subjects?
- Will I enjoy these subjects?

Remember, you need to be researching all the different career paths and subject options you can.

Art - 3D Design	A Level	5 in 3D Design or 5 in Art. If neither subject have been studied at GCSE, please contact Mr Tim Rayner.
Art - Fine Art	A Level	5 in Art. If you have not studied Art at GCSE, please contact Miss Rebecca Bossley.
Biology	A Level	6 in Biology, or 6,6 in Double Science and 6 in Maths.
Business Studies	A Level	5 in Business Studies. If you have not studied Business Studies at GCSE, a 5 in English, 5 in Maths and a 5 in a Humanities subject is required.
Core Mathematics	Level 3 Certificate	4 in Maths.
Chemistry	A Level	6 in Chemistry, or 6,6 in Double Science and 6 in Maths.
